- Demonstrated enthusiasm and commitment to developing skills and knowledge in caring for people
- Demonstrated effective communication (written, verbal and interpersonal) skills
- Been able to work well in groups and as part of a team
- Been reliable and punctual
- An understanding of patient confidentiality
- Shown you want to take the first step in a rewarding and satisfying career in health



On The Job Training

School Based Traineeships in the Health Services Assistance (Assisting in Nursing Work) are available in numerous facilities within Hunter New England Local Health District.

Within your role you will be responsible to and guided by the Registered Nurse / Enrolled Nurse.

Part of your role will include

- Assisting patients with activities of daily living including sponging and bathing
- Changing and making beds/cots
- Assisting with pressure area care
- Transferring and positioning of patients
- Assisting patients with their mobility
- Weighing patients, measuring height and girth
- Taking and recording patient observations as directed by the nurse in charge
- Documentation
- Constant communication with the Health Care team
- Follow all instructions and guidance of the NUM/RN in charge of the ward
