One of the highlights of Mrs de Plater's career at Mackellar Girls was *"teaching Layne Beachley and asking her to leave the classroom because of her constant chatter"*, an event which they both laughed about when they saw each other out and around in Manly. Several Olympians were also past pupils.

In 1997 Mrs de Plater joined the IHS staff as Maths teacher, and has taught all years and all levels during that time. *"I enjoy challenging the brightest students and also pride myself on patiently explaining the subject to students who are less mathematically minded,"* said Mrs de Plater.

Whilst teaching Maths, Mrs de Plater has also been involved in many extracurricular activities including:

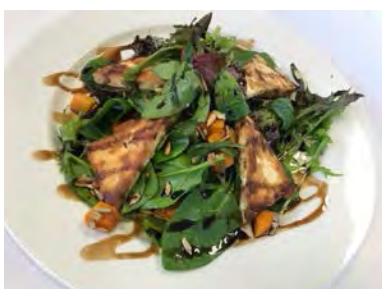
The IHS Koala Café was open for business again recently with Year 11 hospitality students practising all their service skills on delighted staff. Their teacher (and qualified

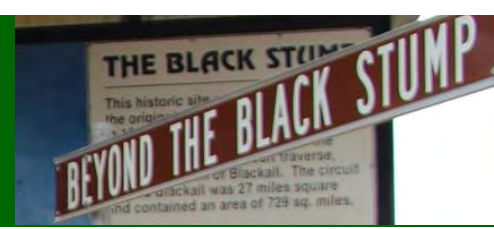
CAPA Tour

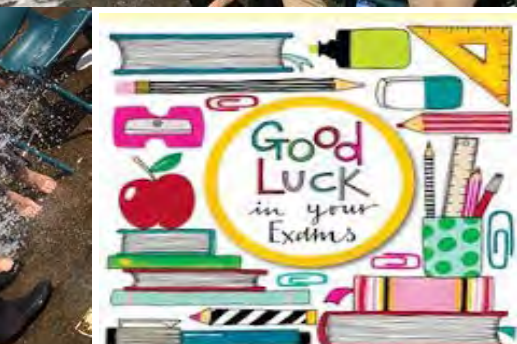
The day kicked off with students greeting

A trial run was held recently with some very eager workers cleaning staff cars – for a fee of course.



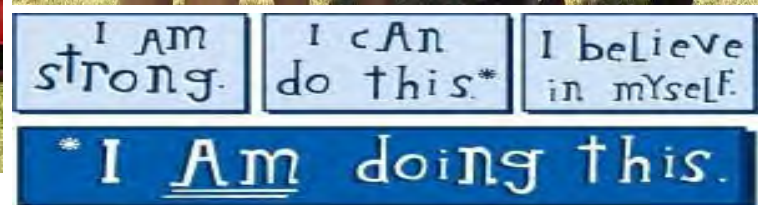

Students wise up to driver safety
