

Green sea turtle Yasi returns seven years on to lay more than 700 eggs on Fitzroy Island


Yasi the green sea turtle has made a long-awaited return to Fitzroy Island off Cairns, laying seven nests of eggs from which more than 700 baby turtles have hatched.

Seven years ago, the turtle was christened for the cyclone that destroyed her eggs, and scientists at Fitzroy Island had been hoping she would return ever since.



While the scientists were not allowed to assist the hatchlings to the water, they fenced off the nests to ensure people did not disturb Yasi or trample her eggs.

Only one in 1,000 turtles reach the age of 30. Yasi herself was believed to be between 60 and 80 years old and had almost certainly been born on Fitzroy Island. "She's got to be one of ours, because they always come back to the same area they hatched in to nest, so she's definitely hatched here on the island and it's her turn to come back and make the next generation," one scientist said.

Well done students!







An application is needed if the student:

- Has not had a travel pass before
- Is moving from Year 6 to Year 7
- Is changing schools
- Is changing address

How to apply

- Complete the application at <u>transportnsw.info/school-</u> students (this is the easiest way to apply)
- Once completed online, this will generate a report to the school so we can approve the application
- Once approved, the School Opal Card will be sent to the address provided on the application within 10 business days

To report a lost, stolen or damaged Opal card

- Go to <u>www.apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/reportPass</u> and follow the instructions to Replace School Opal Card
- DO NOT apply for a new Opal card
- Please allow up to 10 business days to receive your card.
 An email will be sent to your nominated email address that confirms you have ordered a replacement School Opal Card. Please keep this email for your records.
