Enrolments 2019

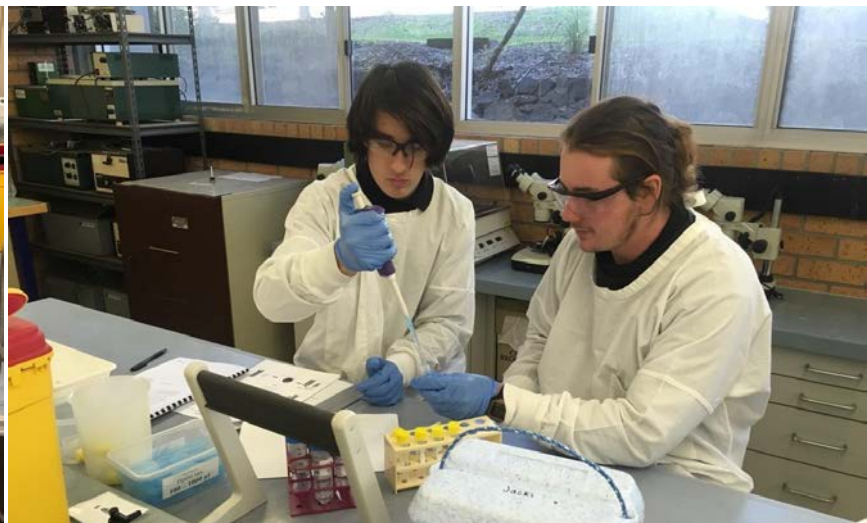


Experiment Fest

Who needs to apply?

An application is needed if the student:

- has not had a travel pass before
- is moving from Year 6 to Year 7
- is changing schools
- is changing address.

How to apply

1. Complete the application at transportnsw.info/school-students (this is the easiest way to apply)
2. Once completed online, this will generate a report to the school so we can approve the application
3. Once approved, the School Opal Card will be sent to the address provided on the application within 10 business days

To report a lost, stolen or damaged Opal card

1. Go to www.apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/reportPass and follow the instructions to Replace School Opal Card
2. **DO NOT** apply for a new Opal card
3. Please allow up to 10 business days to receive your card. An email will be sent to your nominated email address that confirms you have ordered a replacement School Opal Card. Please keep this email for your records.
