Subject Selections

Subject selections has commenced for students in Year 10 for elective subjects that they will study in 2019. Year 10 students have two rounds of subject selection in preparation for Year 11 (2019). The first round determines the subject line pattern. This essentially is what subject runs at the same time as another. A student cannot study two subjects that are being taught at the same time. By having students indicate their preference we aim to structure the subject lines in such a way that the majority of students are able to select the majority of the subjects that they would like to study for their HSC. Irrawang High School Buy a Bale Campaign

Irrawang High School is Pitching in to help our Hunter Valley farmers

For the month of August our school has been right behind the Rural Aid Buy a Bale campaign to help drought stricken farmers in the Hunter Valley. Rural Aid Counsellor Gary Bentley addressed our school about the seriousness of the situation with the big dry, and the financial and mental health issues the farmers faced.

The first week students had an out of uniform day with the theme "Life on the Farm", followed by a sausage sizzle with all food provided by Woolworths North at MarketPlace, a Parma for a Farmer burger from Café Irrawang the following week and a cake stall on the last Friday. Students have been asked for a gold coin donation for these activities or they can bring in a bag of bottles/cans to recycle, or recycle them at home and bring in the redeemable vouchers.

However, all school families have been encouraged to bring in non-perishables/gift cards for the whole month, to be distributed by Rural Aid. And the response has been overwhelming.

The fundraising effort culminates in a P&C trivia night to be held at the Muree Golf Club on September 14. This has been a fantastic effort by the whole school and wider community and is sincerely appreciated. Our school may be a small cog in the Buy a Bale campaign but every little bit helps. Congratulations to the Year 11 Hospitality students who did a wonderful job of catering for the pre-show VIP party at Showcase and for the Education Week Award ceremony.




Showcase 2018



Who needs to apply?

opal

An application is needed if the student:

- Has not had a travel pass before
- Is moving from Year 6 to Year 7
- Is changing schools
- Is changing address

How to apply

- Complete the application at <u>transportnsw.info/school-students</u> (this is the easiest way to apply)
- Once completed online, this will generate a report to the school so we can approve the application
- Once approved, the School Opal Card will be sent to the address provided on the application within 10 business days

To report a lost, stolen or damaged Opal card

- Go to <u>www.apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/</u> <u>reportPass</u> and follow the instructions to Replace School Opal Card
- **DO NOT** apply for a new Opal card
- Please allow up to 10 business days to receive your card. An email will be sent to your nominated email address that confirms you have ordered a replacement School Opal Card. Please keep this email for your records.

Have you changed your personal details? In order to keep our records up-to-date, if your student has any change in their personal details eg doctor, medical condition, emergency contact, telephone no., address etc, please inform the school ASAP.
