News from Busways

- If there's a seat belt on your seat make sure you wear it, the way you do while travelling in the car (click clack)!



Kip McGrath scholarship


Year 10 student Emily Green is the fortunate recipient of the Term 1 Kip McGrath Raymond Terrace scholarship.

News from the Science Faculty

Welcome back to Term one 2019. This term junior students will study the following;

Year 7

Forces: Bridge building design focusing on incorporating classroom learning to build a bridge that can hold a set mass.

Year 8

Ecology: which focuses on the interactions of living things with each other and their environment.

Year 9

The changing Earth: This topic introduces students to what makes up the layers of the Earth and how this is responsible for creating earthquakes and volcanoes.

Year 10

Electricity: Students develop a greater understanding of what electricity is and how it is generated.

Footwear safety in Science

The Department of Education and Community (DEC) clearly outlines footwear requirements in schools:

"Substantial footwear appropriate to practical activity should be worn. Footwear such as thongs, open weave shoes, soft slip-on shoes, shoes with openings at toes or heels, soft sole shoes, shoes without a heel, platforms or high heel shoes should not be worn.

Examples of suitable footwear are:

Workplace Health and Safety legislation makes it mandatory for all students to wear black, solid and enclosed shoes within the school grounds especially in practical and science areas. These shoes are suitable and meet WH&S requirements:



- They all have solid uppers
- There are no punched holes
- They are **NOT** canvas
- They cover the upper part of the foot




