Their highly coveted sculptures and paintings can be seen in art galleries and public sites in over 250 cities. They're Archibald Prize Finalists and have won the Chianciano Biennale in Italy, together with winning 2 years in a row People's Choice Award in Sydney's Sculpture by the Sea, among other notable awards and accolades.'

Gillie and Marc were at the marina to unveil the marina's latest sculpture 'We go Together', featuring the world famous and life size 'dogman' and 'rabbit woman' on a red Vespa.

From the Mathematics faculty


This term students in Years 7-10 had the opportunity to apply their understanding of mathematics in more practical and creative ways. Year 7 students have been learning about Fractions and Probability, and their assessment task this term required them to create their own board game based around these concepts. Many students astounded us with their originality and creativity.





Year 8 students have been developing their ICT skills, particularly in Excel.

Students spent the first five weeks this term learning about Data Collection and Statistics and class activities were based on the SBS documentary 'War on Waste.'



Students were given the

opportunity to collect data on their own area of interest such as Olympic Sports, Endangered Animals and Health of Young People. They used their findings to produce an infographic which is a collection of engaging graphs and images that clearly communicates information in an easy-to-read format.

Year 12 Mathematics, Extension and Standard students have been busy studying for their upcoming HSC Examinations. Teachers in the Mathematics faculty want to wish them all the very best of luck.
