Plan-it Youth Mentoring

The second Plan-it Youth Mentoring Program for 2018 concluded on the 23 October 2018 for three Year 10 students, with a celebration and presentation of certificates.

Plan-it Youth is a mentoring program for students who are considering leaving school



and do not have a clear pathway to employment, training or other education. Each mentor and student pair initially and aim to identify areas of work that may interest the student, and then explore the education, training and employment implications. Typically, a team of mentors come to the school at a designated time for one or two terms. In the early stages of the program, mentors and students are matched: the matching process is called "Jitters Day." Mentors and their mentees spend approximately one hour together each week.

Mentors share their life experiences, skills and knowledge to help a young person plan for their future. Effective mentoring is a relationship that focuses on the needs of the mentee, fosters caring and supportive relationships, encourages all mentees to develop to their fullest potential, and is a strategy to develop active community partnerships. The students were well supported by their mentors, families and friends.

News from TAS

The TAS department includes the areas of Industrial Arts, Home Economics, Computing and Agriculture. With such a wide variety of subject areas there is always something happening in this Faculty.

The one subject that brings together all these specialty areas is Technology Mandatory, a compulsory subject which runs in Years 7 and 8. It encompasses all the traditional areas mentioned, as well as new developments in the area of Digital Technology. This year we have been trialling new modules in accordance with the compulsory introduction of the new Syllabus in 2019. This year students in Years 7 and 8 have been gaining experience not only in Timber, Metal, Food, Textiles, Agriculture etc., but additionally in Coding, Computer Aided Graphics, Laser Cutting & 3D Printing. Exciting times indeed!

In the Industrial Arts area there has been a great deal of development in both the subjects being offered and the physical environment that the students work in. These developments have all been to cater for the interest and needs of our current and future students.

A Technical Drawing room has been converted into a collaborative learning space, allowing students to more easily do group work, with full access to computers, in a project based learning environment in line with the school's future focused learning direction.

We have developed a specialty iSTEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) classroom for group projects and challenges. The iSTEM room has been set up in what was the timber room and chosen for its close proximity to the computer lab.

The iSTEM room has proven a great asset under the guidance of Mr Graham, some of the projects/challenges undertaken included:

 Bottle Rockets and Planes for the Velocity Challenge; Mars Rover; CADCAM and Motion project on Alternate Power Sources.

Equipment in the iSTEM room includes:

 2 x 3D Printers; 1 x Laser Cutter; Vacuum Former; Bottle Rocket Launcher; Power Anchor.

Timber continues to be a popular subject, with the loss of one our traditional rooms to iSTEM there was a need for another workspace, it was a great opportunity to develop a new space with a blank canvas. The new Senior Timber Room has some the latest and greatest equipment available and would be the envy of any high school.


Our Metal department has been condensed into one room so all equipment is readily available to students in one area.




News from Maths

In Mathematics, we are excited to move with the future, and keep up with the latest theories of best practice to give each student their best chance for success.

HSC

Recently, Year 12 sat their HSC for Mathematics. We are looking forward to the results, knowing that a number of students worked extremely hard in the lead up to their exams. There was a record number of students sitting the highest course and it was inspiring to see their passion for Mathematics.



Junior Assessment Week

Week 5 of Term 4 was assessment week for junior students. Many students accessed the support of their teachers throughout their break times, including morning, recess and lunch lessons, as well as snack and study where there are always at least two maths teachers each week. Students received a booklet with revision of the assessable topics two weeks before the exam to help with their preparation. We are very proud of the efforts of our dedicated staff and students during the assessment period.

Year 11 Flipped Learning and Excursion

Students completed Year 11 at the end of Term 3, and have begun their HSC this term. A number of students have been involved in an innovative method for learning called "Flipped Learning." Flipped Learning provides students the opportunity to take responsibility for their own learning, manage their time, fit their study and progress around part time jobs and extra-curricular activities. Students are provided with videos and examples of all content, and access to laptops. There are two teachers on the class,

and students have access to the future focused classroom, with whiteboard desks and spaces for cooperative learning. While this new style of learning has definitely challenged some students, they have learned a great range of skills to prepare them for the real world and we see it as a huge success.

To celebrate the resilience and explore "real-learning" opportunities, Year 11 attended an excursion to Sydney where they completed a "great race" around circular quay and stayed at the Youth Hostel in Sydney. We took the opportunity to read timetables, solve challenges and visit famous historical places. Dinner was at China Town, and we finished off the excursion with a trip to the stock exchange. Those students who were involved were outstanding, with exceptional respect and a positive attitude.

Accelerated and Enrichment Students

A number of students are currently participating in acceleration and enrichment classes. Students performing at the highest of levels are invited to work in their own time with a specialist teacher and at their own pace to achieve to their potential. In 2019, eight Year 8 students will be invited to participate in the enrichment and acceleration classes.

Numeracy Program

One hundred and sixteen Year 8 students are currently participating in an intensive numeracy program, which involves small group activities using hands-on approaches to engage and improve mathematics. Students range in abilities and classes and are very appreciative of the help. This program has been running for six years and highly successful in improving both skills and attitude towards mathematics. These results have been long lasting, and students who have recently participated in their HSC would have benefitted from these lessons in previous years. A big thank you to Mrs Garner for designing and organising the program and always having the students' best interests at heart.



Year 7 Future Focused Teachers

In 2019, Miss White and Mr Pi will be delivering lessons based on the school's new "Future Focused" model. This includes teaching from a holistic approach and involving multiple subject areas to deliver engaging lessons that encourage skills for students to have a successful future.
